

SIXTY YEARS OF LIVING UNITED

On October 2, 1961, a Certificate of Incorporation of the United Fund of Lincoln was filed in the county recorder's office. The organization was formed to combine several health and charity fund raising drives into one single campaign. The formation of the United Fund had been discussed by community leaders for many months at Chamber of Commerce meetings. A study was initiated and led to the formation of what is now the United Way of Logan County.

The first United Fund Campaign was chaired by Lewis C. Horton and launched in November of 1961. \$33,688 was raised during the drive and distributed to five different agencies: The Boy Scouts, Girl Scouts, Salvation Army, Logan County Mental Health Association and the Red Cross. In 1989 the organization became the United Way of Logan County. Thanks to these civic minded founders, and the generous support of local businesses, organizations and individuals, millions of dollars have been distributed to help thousands of community residents when they needed it most through the work of our partner agencies. United Way dollars stay in the community, as they always have through sixty years of LIVING UNITED.

COMMUNITY IMPACT

In 2021, \$75,000 was invested in 15 different programs that provided vital services in our community to hundreds of Logan County residents — seniors, youth and families. Over \$31,000 of Federal Funds were secured and distributed through local agencies to help those in financial need through the Emergency Food and Shelter Program, led by the United Way of Logan County.

Additionally a \$10,000 Healing Illinois Grant was acquired and allocated to the Lincoln Diversity and Inclusion Commission to support their work in Lincoln and Logan County. The Weekly Diversity Challenge was also sponsored to educate our community and drive positive change.



Logan County 2-1-1 was introduced to our community and

sponsored by the United Way of Get Connected. Get Help." Logan County. 2-1-1 is an easy to remember phone number that connects people with important community services and resources when help is needed at no cost. In the first 6 months, 85 community members received assistance through 2-1-1 with financial, medical, legal and other problems.



Thanks to grants from the Illinois Prairie Community Foundation and the Tomlinson Charitable Trust along with other financial contributions from local groups and individuals, the Dolly Parton Imagination Library grew in Logan County and is now available to all children from birth to age 5 in 11 towns and villages in Logan County as of August of 2021. As of September 2021, 99 children are receiving books monthly and over 600 books have been sent to date to the homes of local children to encourage a love of reading and learning.
